Health Profile 2014

Health in summary

The health of people in Kensington and Chelsea is varied compared with the England average. Deprivation is higher than average and about 23.8% (4,900) children live in poverty. Life expectancy for both men and women is higher than the England average.

Living Ionger

Life expectancy is 12.4 years lower for men and 6.3 years lower for women in the most deprived areas of Kensington and Chelsea than in the least deprived areas.

Child health

In Year 6, 20.1% (172) of children are classified as obese. The rate of alcohol-specific hospital stays among those under 18 was 35.9*. This represents 10 stays per year. Levels of teenage pregnancy and GCSE attainment are better than the England average.


Adult health

In 2012, 11.2% of adults are classified as obese, better than the average for England. The rate of alcohol related harm hospital stays was 426*, better than the average for England. This represents 592 stays per year. The rate of self-harm hospital stays was 63.5*, better than the average for England. This represents 103 stays per year. The rate of smoking related deaths was 255*, better than the average for England. This represents 159 deaths per year. Estimated levels of adult excess weight and physical activity are better than the England average. Rates of sexually transmitted infections, people killed and seriously injured on roads and TB are worse than average. Rates of statutory homelessness, violent crime and drug misuse are worse than average. Rates of long term unemployment, new cases of malignant melanoma, early deaths from cardiovascular diseases and early deaths from cancer are better than average.

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
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
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Deprivation: a national view

This chart shows the percentage of the population in England and this area who live in each of these quintiles.




Life Expectancy: inequalities in this local authority

The charts below show life expectancy for men and women in this local authority for 2010-2012. Each chart is divided into deciles (tenths) by deprivation, from the most deprived decile on the left of the chart to the least deprived decile on the right. The steepness of the slope represents the inequality in life expectancy that is related to deprivation in this local area. If there were no inequality in life expectancy as a result of deprivation, the line would be horizontal.

Life Expectancy Gap for Men: 12.4 years




Life Expectancy Gap for Women: 6.3 years




Health inequalities: changes over time

Health Summary for Kensington and Chelsea

A red circle means that this area is significantly worse than England for that indicator; however, a green circle may still indicate an important public health problem.
